#### **Message from the Principal**

Dear Raider Nation,

I hope this message finds you well after a restful weekend! Thank you for your patience last week as our drop-off lines were extra slow due to the cold

temperatures and an increase in cars. In addition, on Friday, Golf was closed while the city was repairing some utilities. When we see that the traffic is heavy, we do not count students tardy until several minutes after 8:00 am, so we hope that lessens a little bit of your stress. On the Granada side of the school, we are hoping to alleviate some of the backup that develops on High School by opening an additional door for students further west and near the bike racks. We encourage cars to pull up as far as possible in the Granada drop-off lane, and we ask that drivers do not stop at the very first door if there is room to pull forward toward the next door. By making this adjustment, we can have many more cars dropping off at one time.

Last week, I shared with you that we are having an issue with several students who arrive at school without their ID badge, which is required to enter the school. Our security quards are required to check for ID for anyone who enters the school each day, and they are now having students write their names on a list if they arrive without their badge. Starting Monday, any student who arrives without their badge will sign the list and be required to call home to parents to bring their badge to school. These students will also be **issued a detention**. The same issue persists in the cafeteria where the ID badge is required to be scanned to pay for lunch. Without their badge, students must tell the cashiers their number, which slows down the lines. We are asking teachers to remind students to have their badge ready before heading to the cafeteria, and we will be sending them back to their classrooms to get their badges before getting lunch since the majority say they left them in their backpacks when asked where they are. We believe that having their student ID to enter the school each day and to purchase their lunch are small asks that require minimal effort. Please help us by speaking with your students about showing responsibility and integrity by following expectations.


